A not-for-profit with 276 registered members (packs a lot more punch though)

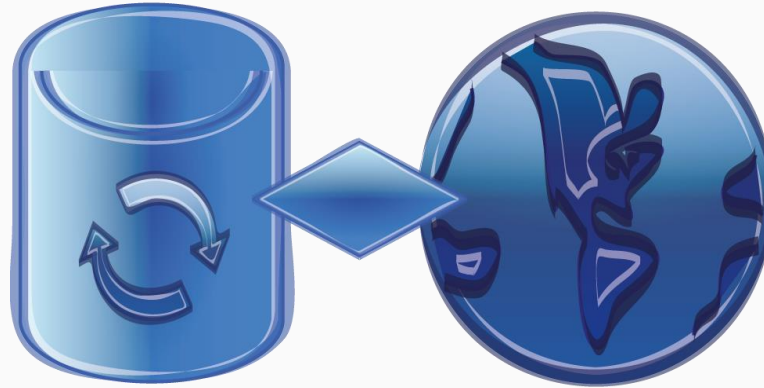
One of the most active nodes of the international Open Knowledge network

An information request by Leo Lahti to the Aalto University to provide details concerning expenditure on licensing agreements with international publishers


→ A ruling from administrative court of justice, that the information needs to be released

Leo Lahti represented OKFFI in an Open Science Best Practice workshop in Norwich, which resulted in the Open Science Peer Review Oath:

Principle 1: I will sign my name to my review – I will write under my own name

Principle 2: I will review with integrity

Principle 3: I will treat the review as a discourse with you; in particular, I will provide constructive criticism

Principle 4: I will be an ambassador for good science practice

Principle 5: Support other reviewers

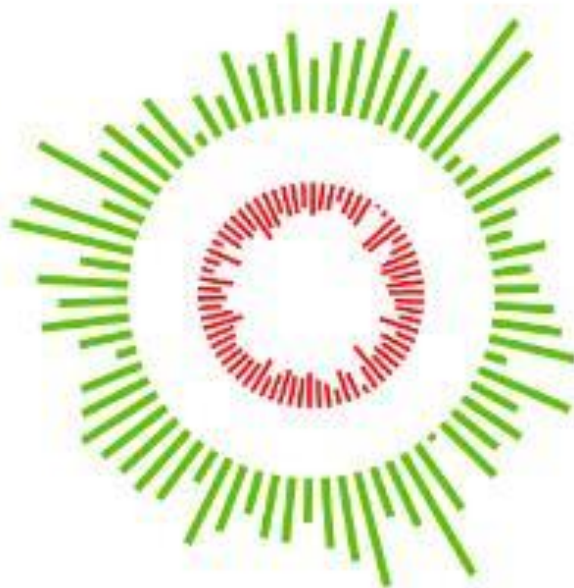
